YOUR GREEN SEPTEMBER GARDEN

A green garden starts with the right plants. In our climate, you want to choose plants that can withstand both high heat and water restrictions, while still offering interest, variety and ease of care. See a few of our favorite new arrivals below; then read on for more tips about how to keep your garden, home and landscapes green no matter the conditions.



Opuntia x Walk in Beauty

Cacti are a classic, safe choice for a low-maintenance garden landscape. This new hybrid series of flowering prickly pear comes in spined and spineless varieties. We now carry 'Watermelon Man' with pink flowers, 'Mandarin Sunrise' with orange flowers, and 'Apricot Glory' with peach flowers.



Agave 'Reggae Time'

Agaves offer texture, color and interest to your green garden. Also known as Cow's Horn Agave, this specimen's decorative red-edged leaves look (and feel!) sharp next to grays and light greens, or plant it adjacent to a red-bloomer such as Achillea Red Velvet to pick up the color. Grows large, 2-3 ft tall by 5-6 ft wide.



Japanese Maple 'Ryusen Weeping'

Japanese Maples can be sensitive to heat, but Ryusen Weeping, shown here, turns red and gold in autumn and has a beautiful cascading shape unlike any other (think "Cousin It!"). Grows 20 ft tall by 5-6 ft wide, well-suited for narrow spaces and the creative gardener.



Tabernaemontana divaricata 'Flore Pleno' Double-Flowering Crape Jasmine

Brand new to the nursery, this gorgeous, heat-tolerant shrub features wide, dark green leaves and beautifully scented white blooms that are most fragrant at night. They prefer full sun or part shade, but you can find them at our nursery in the shade section.

Pedilanthus bracteatus

These wild, almost alien looking specimens are really fun focal points for a lower-growing



drought-tolerant garden or landscape. Their long, slender stems are topped with unusual, pale peach flowers in summer and fall. Through winter you can enjoy the wily, branching look of the bare stems. Growing up to 7 ft tall, they also make fantastical container plants; just be careful handling them as their milky sap can be a skin irritant. Find them over in our sun-loving succulents and cactus section.

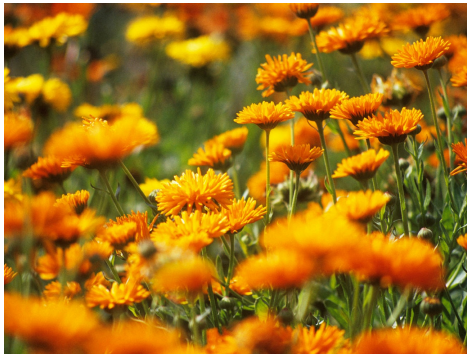
