Featured Plants



Tecoma stans 'Bells of Fire' - A stunning new compact variety, the first with fiery red-orange blooms. This heat and sun-loving shrub explodes with color from spring to frost. Self cleaning, and rarely sets seed pods. Adored by hummingbirds. Easy to grow in landscape or containers. Evergreen in mild winter climates. The more compact nature of this variety lends itself to smaller spaces as a colorful accent or natural hedge. In extremely hot climates, this carefree, desert hardy shrub blooms even in light shade, making it perfect under the canopy of a mesquite or palo verde tree.



Dasylirion wheeleri - Grey Desert Spoon

Long-lived and low-maintenance, this tough plant is native from 3000 to 6000 feet in Arizona, New Mexico, Texas and Mexico. It slowly forms a dense rosette of leathery silver-blue leaves with hooks along the margins. Over time it develops a short stout trunk. The tall narrow flower spikes carry small tan blooms. Plant in full sun or reflected heat, and provide good drainage.

Hesperaloe Pink Parade - Pink Yucca is a recent

introduction, and is getting rave reviews from landscape designers for the architectural form of its flower spikes and foliage. A hybrid between Hesperaloe funifera and Hesperaloe parviflora, this plant is as durable and bullet proof as both parents. The leaves are bright green, about an inch wide, and form an upright clump to 3-4 feet tall and wide.

More excellent drought tolerant choices now in the nursery:

<u>Acacia covenyi - Blue Bush</u>: Native to Australia this though, and very blue, wispy tree is perfectly adapted to the Southwest and the S.F. Bay Area.

<u>Acacia stenophylla - Shoestring Acacia</u>: This fast-growing, evergreen Australian tree produces long, willowy phyllodes that resemble shoestrings dangling in the wind. Creamy white puffball flowers are produced in early spring, followed by long bean-like pods.

<u>Baileya multiradiata - Desert Marigold</u>: This bright yellow perennial blooms all summer in the nursery.

<u>Caesalpinia gilliesii - Yellow Bird of Paradise</u>: A beautiful midsized shrub has naturalized in the Southwest and will bloom most of the summer.

<u>Chilopsis linearis - Desert Willow</u>: Another tough tree that come in several colors. One of our favorites is 'Bubba' with larger dark burgundy flowers.

Eremophila maculata 'Valentine' - *Spotted Emu Bush*: This dense, evergreen Australian shrub provides great winter color. The tiny, dark green leaves develop an attractive reddish tinge in the cold, and masses of hot pink to red tubular flowers are produced from January through March.

<u>Hesperaloe parviflora</u> - *Red Yucca* : While this may be the traditional color of this free blooming Yucca relative there are also <u>yellow</u>, <u>pink</u> and <u>dark red</u> selections.

<u>Leucophyllum langmaniae 'Lynn's Legacy' - Texas Ranger</u>: Provides a profuse display of lavender blooms more often throughout the season than other selections.

<u>Opuntia 'Santa Rita' - Purple Prickly Pear</u>: This cacti has pads that range from blue to purple and contrast with yellow flowers.

Along with what seems like a never ending variety of **Agave, Aloe, Cacti** and **Succulents** there is never a shortage of material to make every garden unique. We have collected many of these plants at the nursery along with additional publications.
